WELCOME TO BRDC CLASSIC

We're looking forward to welcoming you to the BRDC Classic 2026, 24-26 July! It's essential you read this guide to the BRDC Classic with top tips for making your weekend a smoother all-round experience, including:

- Pre-event Sign On & Declaration
- Access passes, routes and timings for:
 - Individual competitors and Multicar Preparers (MCP) access, and how to apply for MCP space in the Support Paddock (if applicable to your grid) or truck parking. See further details on Page 3.
 - the Competitor Campsite
- Competitor Communications onsite

PASSES

Your Grid Organiser will distribute your personnel passes. These will arrive via email, and you can access them using the Silverstone Ticketing App. You will receive tickets to provide access from Wednesday through to Sunday, for the setup and live event:

- 5 Competitor Tickets (7 for two driver races)
- Vehicle Passes are not required for setup on Wednesday 22 July and Thursday 23 July; all competitor vehicles will be granted access via escort from Car Park 49.
- You will receive TEAM wristbands from your Grid Organiser, once you are inside the venue. The wristband grants you access to Race Control, the pit lane and the competitor campsite.





WELCOME TO BRDC CLASSIC

All grids are based in the National Paddock and surrounding Support Paddock areas, and have been separated into the pit garages, tented marquees and space only areas in the Support Paddocks as per the map (overleaf).

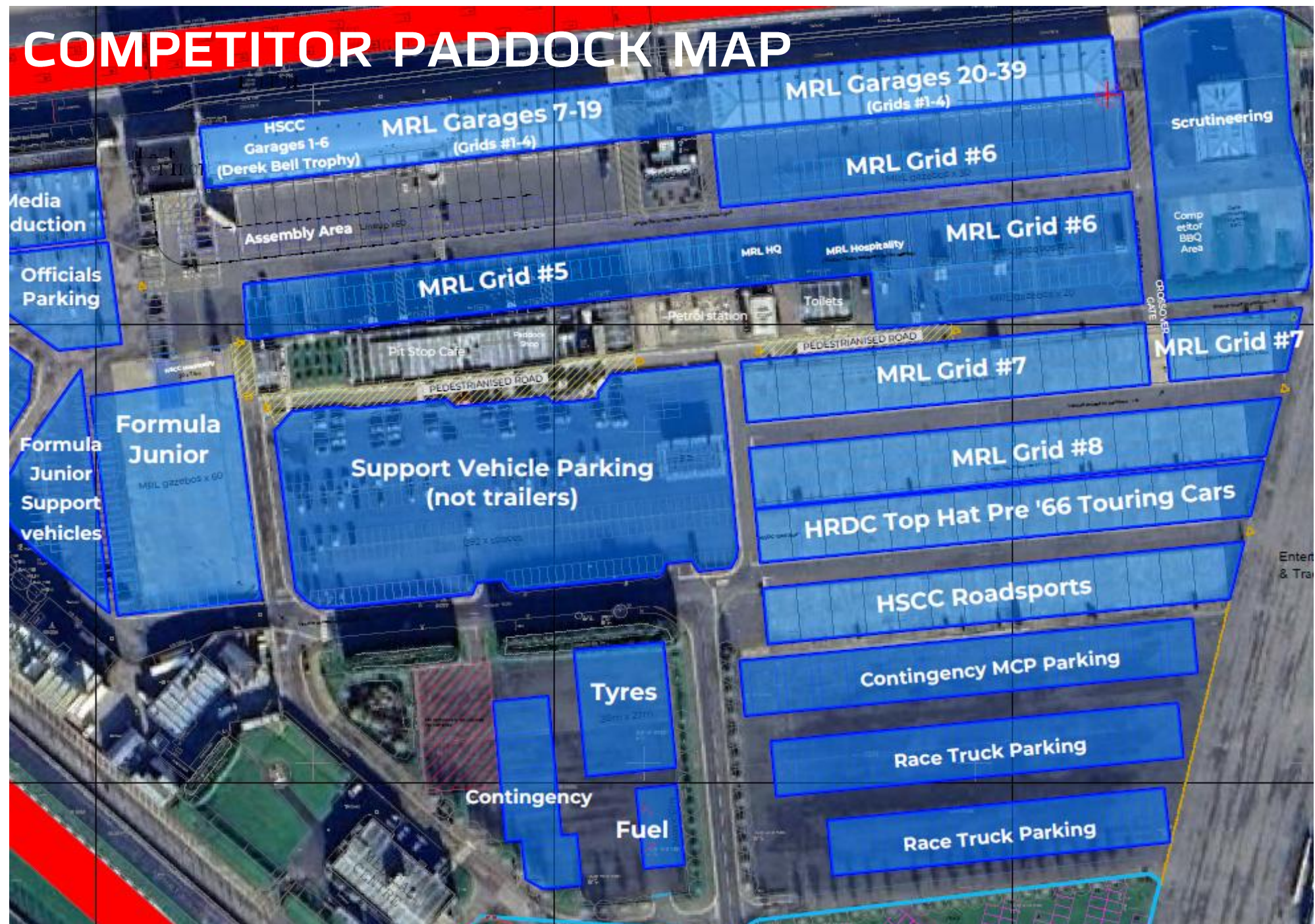
Each grid is either allocated a number of pit garages, a number of marquees, or space in the Support Paddock for Competitors to run their cars from. These are filled as determined by your Grid Organiser. If your car is prepared by a race preparer who is running multiple cars (an MCP), then they must run the car from the assigned pit garage or marquee, or from the assigned space in the Support Paddock.

MCPs running cars from designated pit garages or marquees will have to park their trucks in the Race Trucks parking area (trucks will not be able to park behind pit garages). MCPs running cars in the designated HSCC Roadsports and HRDC Top Hat Pre '66 Touring Cars areas will be able to put their awnings up to house their race cars.

Either way, all MCPs must apply for access and provide a risk assessment and copy of their public liability insurance prior to arriving onsite.

PRE-EVENT

SIGNING-ON & TECHNICAL DECLARATION

Prior to the event, all competitors must sign-on and submit a Technical Declaration for scrutineering purposes. You will receive an email from HSCC with instructions on how to do this. It is mandatory that this is completed prior to your arrival onsite.

SITE SAFETY RULES

To ensure BRDC Classic is compliant with all current Health and Safety legislation it is important that you read and are familiar with the Site Safety Rules document, which includes rules and guidance around issues such as working at height, storage and use of petroleum, speed limits, public safety and no children in pit garages.

MULTICAR PREPARERS

If your car is prepared by a race preparer who is running multiple cars and is either unloading cars and tools into a pit garage or marquee and running the cars from there (and parking the truck in Truck Parking) or who is based with grids in the space only support paddock areas and wishes to put up an awning to prepare cars from, THEY MUST APPLY FOR 'MULTICAR PREPARER' ACCESS TO THE EVENT. Applications must be made by **WEDNESDAY 15 JULY** – please visit: [MCP Booking Form and H&S Checklist](#) for more information and to complete the form.

Please note: An application does not guarantee space in any designated area. Multicar Preparers will NOT be able to enter the site until they have filled in their application form and submitted a risk assessment and a valid copy of their public liability insurance. If they arrive onsite having not submitted these details, it will have to be filled in online there and then to gain access. There will be no exceptions to this, so it is imperative that any race preparer you are employing is made aware of this.

MOTORHOME & CAMPING

Motorhome and camping plots are provided free of charge to competitors at BRDC Classic.

YOU MUST BOOK A PLOT BY **WEDNESDAY 15 JULY**. Please visit: [Competitor Camping Form](#) to book a plot. Please note, motorhomes are NOT allowed in the Paddocks.

TESTING

Testing is on Thursday 23 July from 09:00 to 17:00. To book testing please [click here](#) and follow the instructions. You'll need to provide your name, contact details, address, the number of the testing group you wish to join and card details (to make payment).

ARRIVAL & SETUP - WEDNESDAY & THURSDAY

ACCESS TO VENUE

Each competitor entry will receive 5 Competitor Tickets (7 for a 2-driver race) for personnel access to the venue. Vehicle Passes for vehicle access will be distributed from Car Park 49 and you will be escorted in on first arrival. **YOU WILL NOT GAIN ACCESS TO THE VENUE AT THE MAIN GATE ON FIRST ARRIVAL** (see entry route for setup on page 5). For venue entry, each person will also need to present their ticket in the Silverstone Ticket App to be scanned. **PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU PROVIDE TICKETS FROM YOUR ALLOCATION TO ANY MEMBERS OF YOUR TEAM, PARTICULARLY IF ANY OF YOUR TEAM ARE ARRIVING BEFORE YOU (E.G. A MULTICAR PREPARER), OTHERWISE THEY WON'T BE ABLE TO ENTER THE VENUE.** Any team members, including mechanics, arriving without a ticket from Wednesday to Sunday will have to purchase a ticket before being allowed access.

WEDNESDAY 22 JULY

10:00 – 19:45 Individual Competitors, and pre-booked Multicar Preparers, will have access for set-up in pit garages, marquees or support paddocks.

10:00 Pre-booked Competitor Motorhome & Camping opens in International Paddock. Arrival instructions will follow once an application has been made

19:45 STRICTLY no access to venue for setup after 19:45

THURSDAY 23 JULY

07:30 Paddock and Pit Garage access for further set-up and pre-booked testing from 07:30

08:00 Testing sign-on opens

09:00 – 17:00 Testing

19:45 STRICTLY no access to venue for setup after 19:45

LEAVING SITE IN THE EVENING

If leaving site for the evening on set up days (Wednesday 22 and Thursday 23) with the intention of returning after 19:45, please make sure you are scanned in and out of the venue.

TEAM WRISTBANDS

Each competitor entry will receive 5 TEAM wristbands (7 for a 2-driver race) from your Grid Organiser. The TEAM wristband will be your access to the pit lane during your sessions, race control and the competitor campsite. Wristbands will either need to be collected from your Grid Organiser.

COMPETITOR VEHICLE PASS

This is required for vehicle access to the venue after your initial escort into the venue on first arrival. You will receive this vehicle pass in Car Park 49 on arrival.

COMPETITOR PARKING

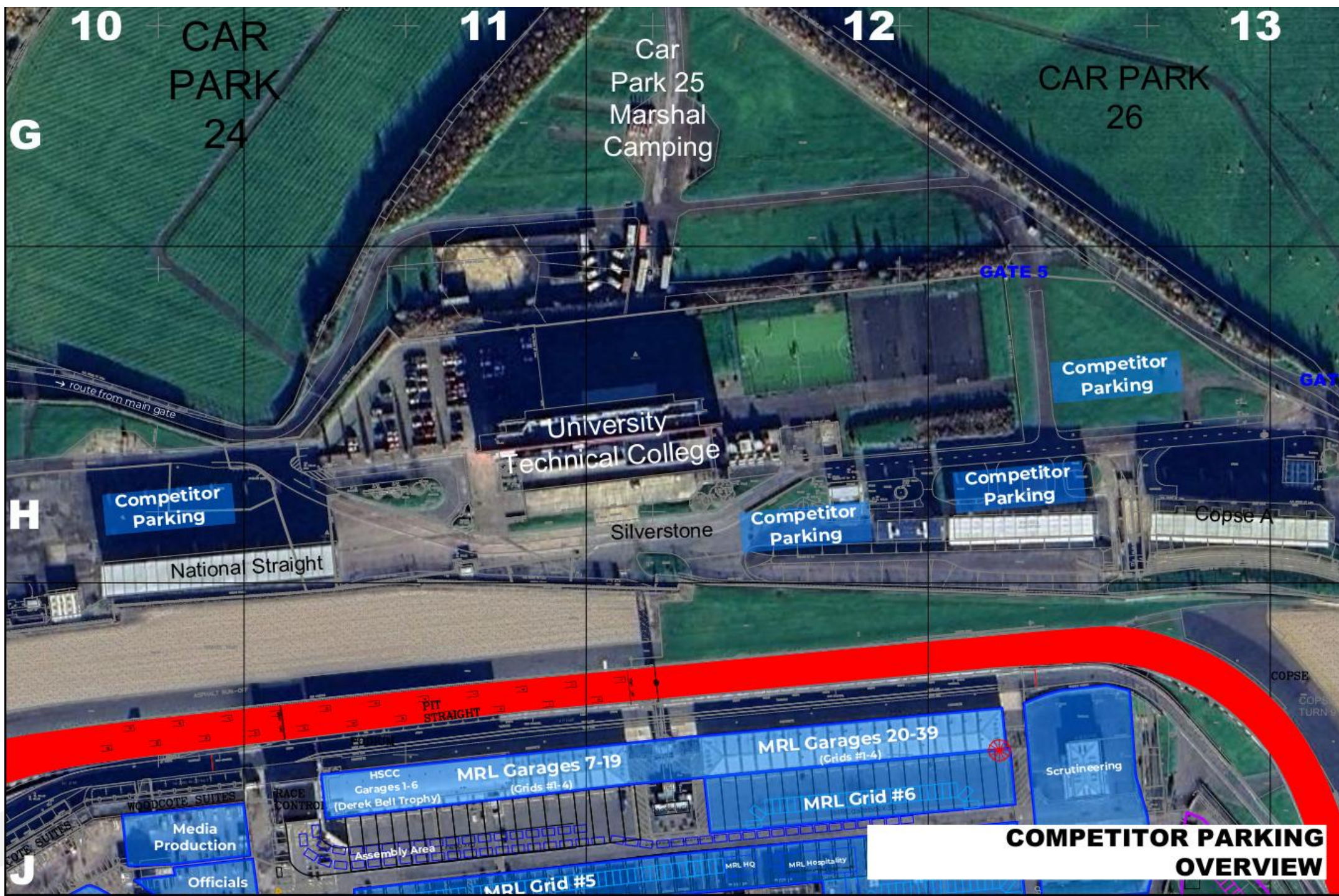
Cars can be parked Outside of National Pit Straight in competitor parking. See locations on page 8.

TRAILERS

Trailers, trucks and transporters not in use for the weekend must be parked in the usual competitor trailer parking area (see the map on page 9). Any trucks housing tools or spares which need to be used over the weekend and do not fit in your designated pit garage or marquee may be parked in Truck Parking close to the paddock at the discretion of the Paddock Management Team (see map for Truck Parking location on page 4).

EVENT DAYS – FRIDAY, SATURDAY & SUNDAY

ACCESS TO VENUE

Your Silverstone Ticket gives you (**but not your vehicle**) access to the venue during the weekend. If you are leaving site, please ensure you scan out so that you are able to scan in again when returning.

COMPETITOR VEHICLE PASS

Please enter via the venue main gate throughout the weekend. Vehicles can be parked in the Competitor Parking areas (see map on page 8). You will receive this vehicle pass from Car Park 49 on arrival on Wednesday 22 July or Thursday 23 July and this must be displayed in your windscreen onsite. If you arrive after Thursday 23 July, please visit Accreditation in Car Park 49 to acquire a Competitor Parking pass.

SUPPORT VEHICLE PASS

As a Multicar Preparer, you can request up to 4 Support Vehicle Passes on the MCP Booking and H&S Form. You will collect these vehicle passes on arrival in Car Park 49. This allows for your vehicles to be parked in Pit Stop Café Car Park.

RESTRICTED Paddock ACCESS

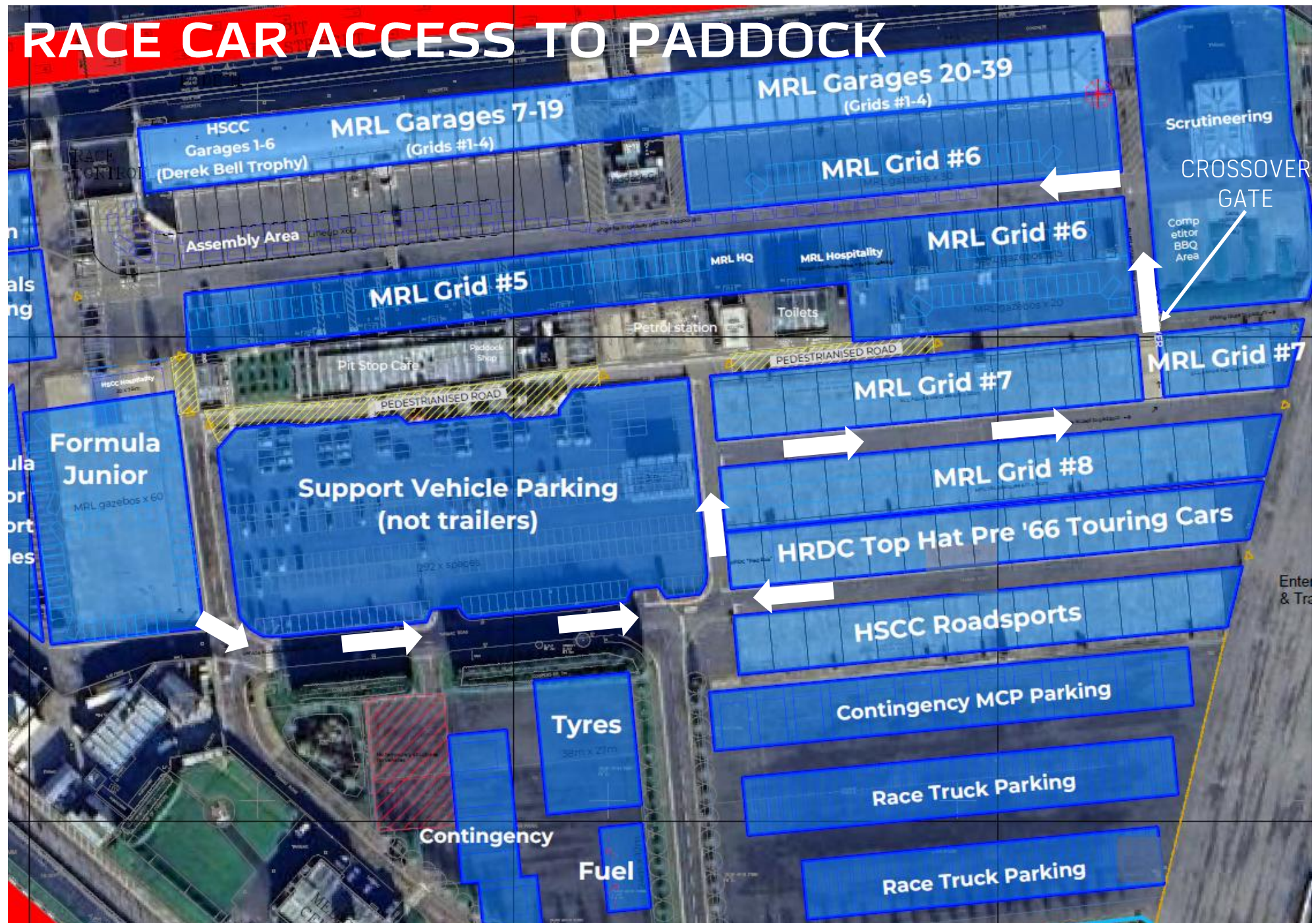
There will be strictly no vehicle access (other than for race cars) into the paddocks during live race timings.

Race cars based in support paddock areas must access the paddock via the “Crossover Gate” – see map on page 11. Please return to your designated areas via the same route.

If teams need to transport tools or spares into the paddock, the paddock management team will have buggies with flat beds to assist with this. There will be no vehicle access for vans.

For timetable updates, please listen out for PA announcements and keep your phone to hand for SMS text message and/ or email updates. Please note, it is the driver's responsibility to check for timetable updates.

SHUTTLE BUSES

Shuttle buses will operate between the National Paddock and the Competitor Campsite at the International Paddock.

PADDOCK BIKES

Bikes, buggies, quads and scooters (but not e-scooters) are welcome for personal use for transfers between the paddock and campsite areas. These vehicles may use the internal Link road, but please keep journeys to an absolute minimum as there may be pedestrian visitors in the infield. You must stick to the designated roadways and persons riding paddock scooters/mopeds/ motorcycles/quads/buggies must hold the appropriate DVLA road licence for the same machine. The rider must wear the appropriate safety helmet at all times and the vehicle must be road-legal, taxed and insured and must not carry any more passengers than the road-legal limit.

Please do not attempt to drink and ride during the weekend.

It is a condition of your entry that all competitors comply with the parking arrangements and instructions regarding paddock bikes. You are responsible for your own safety, your passengers and for the safety of our many visitors.

PLEASE NOTE: USE OF E-SCOOTERS IS NOT PERMITTED.

Failure to comply with the instructions of the stewards and marshals may result in exclusion from the meeting.





FURTHER INFORMATION

BREAKDOWN - SUNDAY

If you are intending on leaving before 19:30, please contact one of the paddock management team to arrange a safe departure. Please make sure your race preparer is aware of this, particularly if they wish to start dismantling awnings etc. whilst the public are in the paddock. Please also be aware that there are many visitors onsite attending the evening concert so please remain vigilant and abide by the speed limits at all times. If staying for the Sunday evening: The National Paddock must be clear by 20:00 Sunday so if you wish to leave your truck onsite overnight, move it to the public car park. The competitor campsite will close and need to be clear by 10:00 on Monday.

BBQ & OPEN FIRES

Barbecues and/or open fires are NOT permitted in the pit garages, paddocks and support paddocks. This is in the interest of safety given the large amount of fuel in use in the pits and paddock areas. If such facilities are found, they will be extinguished and the multicar preparer and/or the competitor responsible may be ejected from the event and the competitor may be disqualified from competing. There will be a designated BBQ area opposite Scrutineering for competitors to use. The fire marshals and security have absolute authority in this respect and their instructions must be complied with.

MARSHALS BBQ & RAFFLE

In recognition of the great work that the marshals do for us all, the drivers will be putting on a BBQ for them on Friday evening at which there will be a raffle. If you wish to donate any prizes to the raffle, please drop them off to the HSCC team at Race Admin on Thursday 23 July. There are likely to be raffles for marshals on Saturday and Sunday as well so don't worry if you are not there on Thursday. Please continue to leave any prizes with the HSCC team in Race Admin in either paddock throughout the weekend.

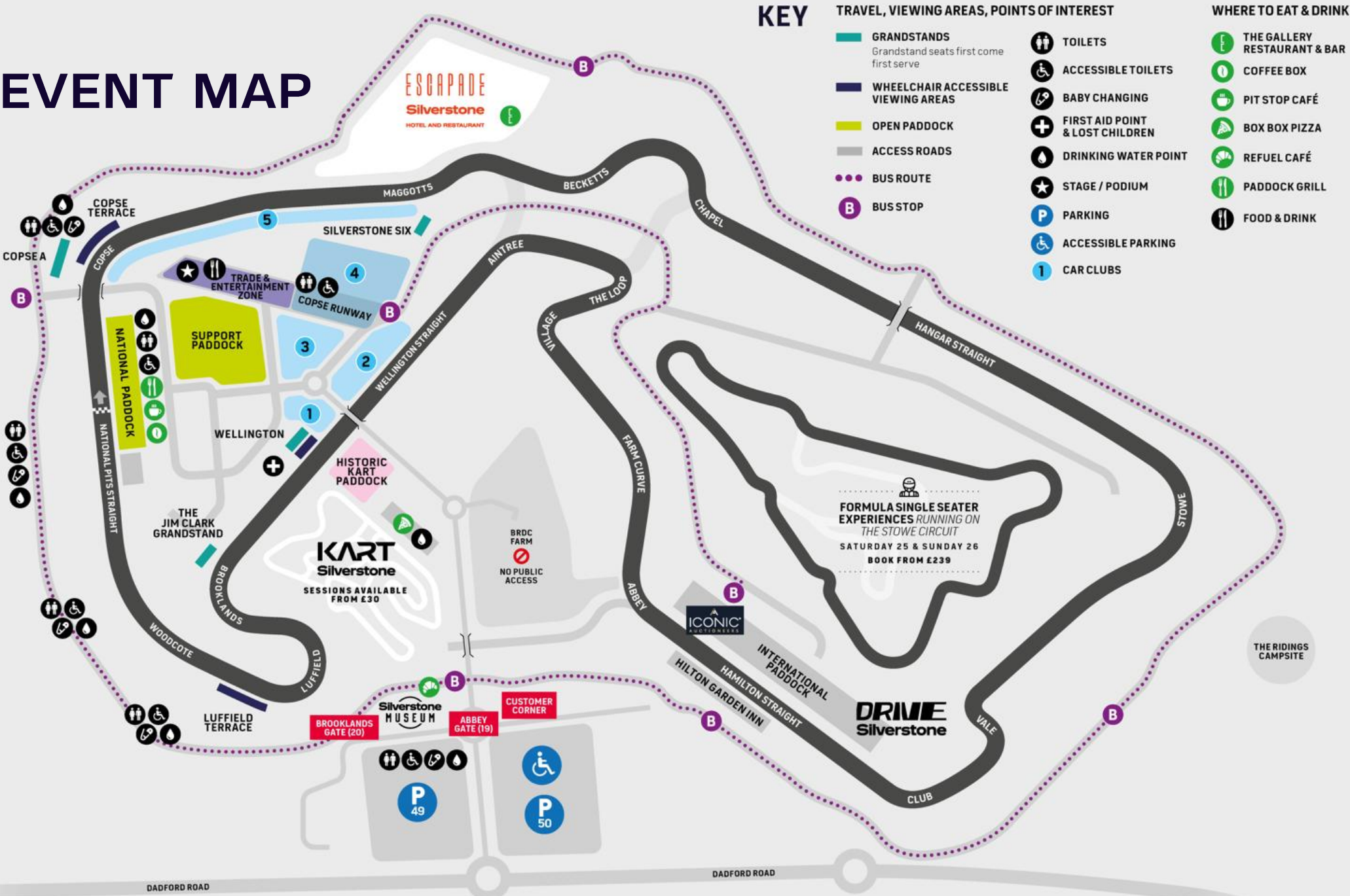
THE MIDNITE SPECIAL
